Mount Joy College is registered in the province of British Columbia, Canada as a private post-secondary educational facility. Like other private colleges, we offer training and academic courses that are gradually becoming recognized and accepted by other educational institutions. Our primary focus is on training counsellors to help treat and console those who are damaged by a combination of childhood mistreatment and pregnancy loss, primarily abortion. We are also gradually expanding our academic calendar, and will be providing courses online and those situated at the college on Mt. Joy, not far from Victoria. Mount Joy College is a non-denominational Christian educational facility. We are situated on a mountain overlooking beautiful hills, the Pacific Ocean, and in the distance, the Olympic Mountains of Washington State. We are gradually building both academic facilities and housing for staff. We have 59 hectares of beautiful mountain terrain with meadows, ponds and tall fir and pine trees.

In October, the College hosted the annual meeting of the International Hope Alive Counsellors' Association. This followed a Level 1 training course. Faculty then put on training courses in Lyons France, Oxford England and Gdansk Poland. The international meeting was able to use a new building that although not completely finished and furnished, was reasonably comfortable for those who were prepared to be good pioneers. The highlight of the IHACA conference was a public forum hosting three ex-abortionist providers: Dr Haywood Robinson, Dr. Noreen Johnson, and Ms. Pat Archer RN who shared how they were seduced by the appeal of money and power into providing abortions, how performing abortions affected them and their family and how Christ enabled them to stop. With paintings, Dr. Marie Peeters-Ney presented the impact of Post-abortion Survival Syndrome on modern art. Dr. Philip G. Ney, described statistics from scientific studies of the impact of abortion on health. In a special meeting for students, there were testimonies from those who survived when some of their siblings were aborted.

We look forward to your continuing and renewed interest in the college. The next newsletter will provide information about other trainings and courses to be held at the college.
